The CPL applicant PROCESS:

1. The applicant must complete <u>a valid CPL training</u> course meets all of the State's requirements for fire arm training outlined in Section 5J of 1927 [LH1] PA 372.

KEEP IN MIND THAT your training certificate is valid for one year only.

- 2. The applicant must apply to the county clerk in the county he/she resides in, upon making application.
 - -The applicant must have Michigan ID and must be 21yrs of age.
 - -The applicant must present a valid CPL certificate.
 - -The Saginaw, Bay City, and Midland county clerks will import your photo from the Michigan Driver's license program, so that photo will be typically used for your CPL.
 - -At the time of making application, and paying \$115 the applicant must have classifiable fingerprints taken by the county clerk, state police, sheriff's office, local police agency.
 - -The county clerk has 45 days to issue or deny the license (typically the license is issued and returned to the applicant within 15 days, as told to me by previous students.

After downloading the Michigan Concealed Pistol License Application <u>**READ** pages 1 through</u> 6....this is a must!

If you are filling in the application with your personal information <u>**DO NOT** sign it</u>, unless you are <u>under the immediate observation and direction</u> of a County Clerk's representative.

<u>Typically</u> the turnaround time on receiving your CPL from the time of applying at the County Clerk's office to the day you walk out to your mailbox, in most case is about 14 days (that being said <u>DO NOT quote</u> me because <u>yours will probably take the full 45 days</u>.)
